

# Introduction & Familiarisation Policy

The Dog Nook at Cranbrook recognises how important it is to feel confident about where your dog is staying - and for your dog to feel comfortable too. That's why every new dog who joins us, begins with a gentle, no-pressure introduction session. This helps us get to know each other, check everyone's a good fit, and make sure your dog feels safe, secure, and settled from the start.

## Free introductory session

Every dog has a free 1-2 hour visit before any daycare or boarding bookings are confirmed. During this relaxed session:

- Your dog can explore the home and garden at their own pace.
- They'll meet our resident dogs in a calm, managed way.
- We'll chat with you about your dog's routine, personality, and any special needs.
- It gives us all a chance to see how your dog responds to the environment - and to each other.

There's no pressure to stay if it doesn't feel right - for you or your dog.

## Gradual familiarisation

If your dog is a bit unsure or takes time to settle:

- We may suggest shorter trial visits before full days or overnights.
- Familiarisation can be tailored to help build confidence gently and positively.
- We never rush introductions each dog is treated as an individual with their own pace and comfort zone.

## Ongoing communication

After the intro session, we'll share honest feedback - and if everyone's happy, we'll move forward with bookings. If we think a different setup might suit your dog better, we'll always say so with care and transparency.

#### Licencing considerations

In line with our Animal Activity Licence and best practice:

- We assess all dogs before accepting them into group care.
- We do not accept bookings for dogs we haven't met in person.

#### Why it matters

Starting slowly sets the tone for everything that follows. By taking the time to get to know your dog - and letting them get to know us - we're building trust from the very beginning. It means fewer surprises, less stress, and a smoother transition into care. For us, it's not just about who *can* come - it's about who will *feel at home* here. That's what makes The Dog Nook feel different - and why we take this part so seriously.
